

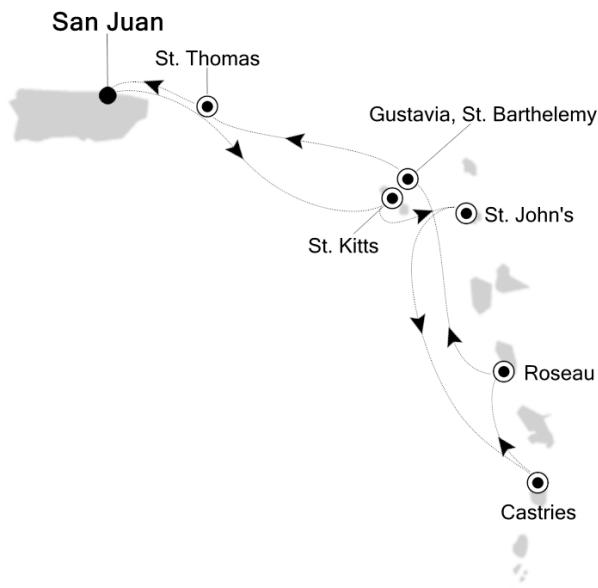

General Information

ORGANISED SHORE EXCURSIONS

Booking Direct with Silversea gives you peace of mind. Our local tour operators are fully insured and have been comprehensively vetted. In the unlikely event of issues with a Silversea tour, we assume responsibility and the ship will wait for our delayed shore excursion. These are important factors when comparing value. Please bear in mind as we traverse many far reaching destinations, the local infrastructure varies and is beyond our control. Road conditions and vehicles available locally may not be up to standards we are accustomed to. Guides and drivers may speak with a heavy accent at times depending on the port of call. Be assured however that at Silversea, we contract only the best tours and best operators available at each destination. Please Note: Silversea reserves the right to make any changes or modify a tour in case of unforeseen circumstances and/or to ensure the safety and comfort of our guests.

BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

Shore Excursions are available on a first-come, first served basis. Guests should note that some shore excursions are very popular with guests and often ending up being waitlisted. In order to avoid disappointment, it is therefore suggested to book in advance via my.silversea.com until 48 hours prior to sailing. Last-minute requests to participate in excursions are subject to availability, which in some cases may not be determined until departure time pier-side. If changes or cancellations are required once onboard, tickets must be returned to the Shore Concierge Desk within the cancellation deadline. For our selected Shore Excursions Tickets returned after the cancellation deadline will be charged 100% cancellation fee to the guest's onboard account. Cancellation deadlines for the majority of our shore excursions is 48hrs prior to the port of call. Please note that certain shore excursions might have a different cancellation deadline; all cancellation deadlines are stated in the please note section of the shore excursion, booking form and shore excursion tickets.

ONLINE ADVANCE RESERVATION OF SHORE EXCURSIONS

Silversea operates an online reservation option, allowing guests to reserve their shore excursions at leisure prior to their cruise. In order to access this, please log on to MySilversea (my.silversea.com) up to 48 hours prior to your sail date. If you have reserved your shore excursion online, you will receive further information upon embarkation onboard.

SHORE EXCURSION DEPARTURES TIMES

Departure times are published in the ship's daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicles and on shore excursion tickets. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore. Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and shore excursion departures as local conditions dictate.

ON BOARD RESERVATIONS

You may also reserve and purchase your shore excursions. You will find a shore excursion booking form in your suite and at the Shore Concierge desk. Select the shore excursions in which you wish to participate, then leave the completed and signed form at the Shore Concierge desk prior to the booking deadline indicated. Shore Excursion tickets will be delivered to your suite and your selected excursions charged to your shipboard account. Overland and exclusive excursions must be pre-paid by credit card through your reservation agents. If still available they may also be purchased on board. Shore excursions require a minimum number of participants in order to operate as described. If this minimum number is not met, Silversea reserves the right to offer the programme at a different rate or to cancel the specific departure.

SHORE EXCURSION PRICING

Prices are generally quoted per person, per tour, with the exception of Silver Shore Privato or group-designated excursions. Prices are subject to change without notice. Please visit MySilversea (my.silversea.com) for the most up-to-date information. Discounts for children under 12 years of age are available on some, but not all tours. Prices for children, if available, will be adjusted onboard. Please see the Shore Concierge team prior to your excursion to discuss the availability of children's pricing.

SHORE EXCURSION DEPARTURE TIMES

As a courtesy to fellow guests, shore excursion departures generally will not be announced unless there is an unforeseen change. Departure times from the ship are published in the ship's daily newspaper, the Silversea Chronicles and on shore excursion tickets. Guests are kindly requested to proceed ashore at least 10-minutes prior to the shore excursion departure time. The Shore Concierge team will be pierside to direct you to the appropriate transportation. When the ship is at anchor, guests must allow additional time to tender ashore. Silversea Cruises reserves the right to adjust itineraries and shore excursion departures as local conditions dictate. Please note that approximate pier departure times are also listed in MySilversea (my.silversea.com).

SHORE EXCURSION SUITABILITY

Silversea offers a broad range of activities for our guests of all physical capabilities. However, certain excursions are more appropriate for physically fit and active guests. All excursions offered are clearly identified with an activity level to assist you. We also offer a good variety of Accessible Shore Excursion worldwide (according to the ports availability and local structure) that are designed for guests unable to negotiate motor coach steps or for full time wheelchair/scooter users. The vehicle used on this type of shore excursion is adapted with an access ramp (or lift where available) to accommodate a limited number of mobility devices. In order to use the ramp and/or lift, guests are required to be seated on a wheelchair or scooter. For your safety and enjoyment and that of your fellow guests, please be certain to select excursions that meet your physical capability. We therefore encourage guests to review the excursion description carefully including the PLEASE NOTE section which includes useful information. Silversea also offers port talks onboard. If you have any questions or concerns regarding shore excursion suitability, please contact the Shore Concierge (shoreconciierge@silversea.com) prior to your cruise or visit the Shore Concierge desk for more detailed information once onboard.

ON LAND SILVER SHORE CONCIERGE SERVICES

Expert Shore Excursion professionals are available to assist guests with their destination knowledge, personalised planning and coordination of all private, independent touring suggestions. This could include area highlights, flightseeing, water sports and more. To take advantage of this service, requests should be submitted no later than 15 days prior to sailing and guests must have deposited or fully paid their outstanding balance. Strict cancellation policies apply to confirmed, exclusive programmes.

When emailing shoreconciierge@silversea.com, please communicate your booking number. There is a service fee of \$100 per voyage to secure your arrangements, however this fee will be applied to your confirmed programme in that port. The Shore Concierge team can be contacted by mail at shoreconciierge@silversea.com to arrange tailor-made tours, Monday through Friday.

ONBOARD SHORE CONCIERGE TEAM

Whether you wish to participate in an organised shore excursion or tailor-made shore excursion, Silversea's experienced Shore Concierge team are happy to assist you to plan the best shore-side experiences with knowledgeable suggestions,

personalized planning for sightseeing, water sports, golf and more. The Shore Concierge team is available onboard on sea days from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Office opening hours in port may vary whilst staff is shore-side assisting those on excursions. Please refer to the Silversea Chronicles for daily office opening hours. Once onboard, those considering a bespoke excursion should contact the Shore Concierge team at their earliest possible convenience, as time may be a factor in reaching local contacts. Please be aware that once arrangements are confirmed they are non-refundable.

PORT TALKS

Throughout the voyage the Shore Concierge Manager and Destination Consultant will offer port and shore excursion information prior to arrival in each port of call. Their aim is to give you a travel experience that goes beyond the ordinary and answer as many of your questions as possible. The information is presented in the theatre or is pre-recorded and played on your in-suite entertainment system, and will allow more time to enjoy and immerse yourself in each port.

SILVERSEA SHUTTLE SERVICE

Complimentary transportation may be provided by Silversea when the local town is beyond a reasonable walking distance from the port. This service may not be possible in ports where a strong taxi union exists, preventing Silversea from providing a complimentary shuttle. The availability and schedule for this service will be announced onboard and listed in the Silversea Chronicles. We are not able to advise this in advance. Operationally, intervals between shuttle bus departures could be affected by local traffic. Silversea is not liable for any unforeseen delays. There will be a break in service for driver meal times. Shuttle service is offered during the day only. The shuttle service is designed to augment local transportation; guests requiring more flexibility may prefer not to wait for a shuttle and secure a taxi at their own expense.

CHILDREN ON TOUR

To ensure the safety of our younger guests, participation by children in certain shore excursions may be restricted. Children up to the age of 8 years old are only permitted to participate in suitable Silver Shore Excursions and the shuttle service if the vehicles are equipped with the correct safety harness and seating equipment. Such harnesses' and secure seating cannot be guaranteed. Alternately, guests may use their own approved safety seat, booster seat or harness as long as they are compatible with the local touring vehicle and can properly secure the young guest. Silversea reserves the right to refuse children under the age of 8 years old on any tour on the basis of safety.

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY CHARGES

Please note that photography at some museums, sites and monuments and/or the use of video cameras may not be allowed or may incur a charge. These charges are not included in the tour price and are at guests' own expense. Further details will be in the detailed shore excursion description and please note section. Please ensure to review these in detail prior to departing on your shore excursion.

SHOPPING STOPS

While our organised excursions are not generally geared to the serious shopper, some shore excursions allow for short shopping stops as indicated in the shore excursion description. In the interest of all participants, guests should adhere to the allotted time and return to the tour vehicle promptly as advised by the tour guide or ship's escort. Please Note: The selection of shops is generally left to the discretion of the tour operator. Silversea does require that establishments be reputable, of general interest to our guests and offer quality goods. However, all purchases are the responsibility of the individual.

Moderate Mobility Issue

Tours recommended for guests able to walk short distances, can navigate the steps of a motor coach and at venues, and/or travel with a standard size manual collapsible wheelchair or scooter, (able to fit in the motor coach luggage compartment).

Wheelchair Accessible

SELECTED EXCURSION

BAS-002 / Rail and Sail

Difficulty



Price: \$129 - Duration: 4.00 hr(s)



Explore the idyllic island of St. Kitts from two unique vantage points during this panoramic, half-day sightseeing excursion by rail and sea.

Basseterre, Needs must Train Station, St. Kitts Scenic Railway & Masquerade, Historic Sites, Lush Flora

Depart the pier for the short drive to the Needs must Train Station. Upon arrival, board the St. Kitts Scenic Railway, originally built to transport sugarcane, for an incredibly scenic ride around the entire island. Along the way, take in captivating views of historical sites and lush vegetation, and feel free to tap your feet or dance along to the rhythmic sounds of Caribbean melodies sung by the Scenic Railway Choir. Complimentary drinks are served on the lower level of the railcar.

Luxury Catamaran Cruise, Southwestern Coastline, Fishing Villages, Historic Sugar Plantations

Following your train-ride, de-board the train and transfer to your awaiting luxury catamaran. After embarking the vessel, receive your safety and tour instructions, then begin your picturesque and relaxing catamaran-ride. Enjoy light refreshments whilst sailing along the island's southwestern coastline. En route, pass by local fishing villages and historic sugar plantations. Your tour concludes back at the pier. Upon arrival, disembark the catamaran and commence the short walk back to the ship on-foot.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 328 yards (about 300 metres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coaster, board/deboard the train, and embark/disembark the catamaran. This tour is not suitable for pregnant women, guests with back and/or neck problems, guests with heart and or respiratory conditions, guests prone to seasickness, guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, bottled water, and local currency or credit cards for additional purchases from the ship. Guests must be at least one year old to participate on this tour. Guests must be at least 18 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. Although frequently encountered on this type of tour, wildlife, fish, and marine life sightings are not guaranteed. Operation of this tour is subject to weather conditions. The tour sequence may vary.

BAS-003 / Beach Extravaganza

Embrace the scenic splendour of St. Kitts during this relaxing, half-day beach excursion at idyllic Cockleshell Bay.

Basseterre. Cockleshell Bay & Beach, Caribbean Sea

Depart the pier for the short drive through Basseterre to beautiful Cockleshell Bay, an exquisite getaway nestled on the shores of the beautiful blue Caribbean Sea. Upon arrival at the parking area, a short walk brings you to Cockleshell Beach, where sun chairs will be available for you.

Sunbathing, Beachcombing, Swimming, Spice Mill Restaurant, Refreshment

During your visit, you can relax, unwind, and soak up the warm tropical sun, take a stroll on the sandy beach, marvel at the splendid ocean views, and cool off with a refreshing swim in the inviting Caribbean Sea. Afterward, enjoy a complimentary fruit

punch at the Spice Mill restaurant; additional beverages and food are available at your own expense. At the conclusion of your beach break, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking, at times over uneven, natural, and sandy surfaces, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and at Cockleshell Beach. Walking at Cockleshell Beach is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guest who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up with beach or water shoes, and bring sun protection, a towel, change of clothing, bottled water, and US Dollars, local currency, or credit cards for purchases from the ship. Beach chairs and umbrellas are available for rent at Cockleshell Beach. A complimentary refreshment is included; additional refreshments and food are available at the *Spice Mill* restaurant at your own expense. Guests must be at least 18 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. Restrooms and changing facilities are also available. Operation of this tour is subject to weather conditions. The tour sequence may vary.

BAS-A / St. Kitts Scenic Railway

All aboard the 'Last Railway in the West Indies', the St. Kitts Scenic Railway. This unique island tour runs in a complete circle around St. Kitts allowing guests the opportunity to see the entire country by rail and highway in only three hours.

St. Kitts Scenic Railway

No trip to this two-island federation is complete without the experience of traveling on the St. Kitts Scenic Railway. This one-of-a-kind narrow gauge railroad was built almost a century ago to deliver sugar cane from the fields to the sugar mill in the capital city of Basseterre. The railway now provides a fascinating way to see the island from the comfort of double-deck railcars built specifically for touring the island of St. Kitts. The upper level features a spacious open-air observation deck with panoramic views of the surrounding countryside. The lower level provides air-conditioned comfort with expansive six-foot vaulted windows. Island ambiance is evoked with comfortable rattan furniture, complimentary specialty drinks, island music sung by the Scenic Railway Choir, and a colorful narrative history of the Caribbean.

On this memorable journey, the railway hugs the Northeastern coastline where rippling fields of sugarcane stretch from the shoreline up to the mountains. The high volcanic peaks rise nearly 4,000 feet above sea level, coated with lush green rainforests. The train rolls across tall steel bridges spanning deep 'ghuts', or canyons, and winds through small villages and farms. Your railway tour narrator will point out abandoned sugar estates with overgrown chimneys and windmills, and provide insight into the island's unique history. The duration of the train ride is approximately 1.5 hour.

Scenic Drive

Your experience is complemented by a scenic drive on board the along the Southwestern coast. Enjoy vistas of Brimstone Hill Fortress, the British 'Gibraltar of the West Indies', Middle Island where Thomas Jefferson's great-grandfather is buried, and the neighboring island of Nevis, birthplace of American statesman Alexander Hamilton, the first Secretary of the U.S. Treasury.

Please note: This tour involves minimal walking and is recommended for guests with limited mobility and guests utilising a wheelchair. Wheelchair guests must be able to embark and disembark the coach (2 steps) and the train (3 steps). The order of train and bus tour portions of the program may be reversed.

BAS-B / Culinary Experience & Rum Tasting

Unlock the secret to preparing West Indian cuisine during this flavourful, half-day culinary excursion and tasting at the Fairview Great House.

Fairview Great House and Botanical Garden

Depart the pier for the short drive to the Fairview Great House and Botanical Garden, nestled at the foot of Olivees Mountain. Upon arrival, proceed for a demonstration of West Indian cooking. Tantalize your taste buds as you enjoy St. Kitts' National dishes prepared before your eyes. Discover the history and wonderful flavours of West Indian cuisine, which blends Old and New World cooking with African, European and Indian influences. In addition, taste several flavors of rum; hear the history of where rum came from in the Caribbean and how Caribbean people made their own rum. Hear stories of when the Irish settled on St. Kitts and the rum legacies they left with us and how and where rum drinking has evolved on the island. Afterward, sample the dishes accompanied by homemade refreshments, and receive complimentary copies of the recipes used to prepare them.

Free Time and Great House

Following your demonstration and tasting, some free time is made available to explore the Fairview Great House at your leisure. The main floor of the Great House is furnished in authentic Colonial style. On display is the dining room, with the table set for a delicious West Indian dinner; living room; a gentleman's study; and an historical information room. Here, you can learn more about previous owners of the property, life on a Plantation Estate in St. Kitts during the 18th century and the process undertaken to fully-restore this historic gem. Upstairs is the master bedroom with a large veranda offering a panoramic view of the Caribbean Sea, South-East Peninsula and St. Kitts' sister island of Nevis.

Botanical Garden and Gift Shop

You may also choose to take a delightful stroll through the different areas of the beautifully landscaped, approximately 2.5-acre (about one-hectare) Botanical Garden, and/or browse the gift shop for souvenirs, handicrafts and rum. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking for approximately 164 yards (about 150 metres), with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and up to 35 steps at the Fairview Great House. Walking at the Fairview Great House and Botanical Garden is at the discretion of each guest. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended; camouflage or suggestive clothing is not permitted. Space on this tour is very limited; we suggest you book in advance to avoid disappointment.

BAS-F / Catamaran Snorkel and Cruise

Difficulty

Embrace the picturesque beauty of the Caribbean Sea during this half-day snorkelling and sailing excursion.

Snorkelling at Shittens Bay

Depart the pier aboard a 'Maxi-Cat' catamaran for the scenic, approximate one-hour ride to the cliff-side snorkelling cove at Shittens Bay. En route, see mountains and beaches on one side and the open Caribbean Sea on the other. Upon arrival, receive your safety instructions and snorkelling gear, and begin your snorkelling session in crystal -clear waters teeming with volcanic rock formations, sea fans, sponges and tropical fish.

Sunset Cruise

Next, your ride continues along the pristine coast of the southeast peninsula of St. Kitts to Nag's Head, the southernmost tip of the island. As the catamaran sails back to port, experience the spectacular colours of a Caribbean sea. Enjoy the open bar including fruit juices, rum punch, beer and soft drinks. Your tour concludes back at the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the boat and in/out of the water. This tour is not suitable for guests prone to seasickness, guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover -up, sun protection and bring a towel from the ship. Guests must remove their shoes while on board the catamaran as it is a barefoot cruise. A waiver must be signed by guests who plan to enter the water. Guests who enter the water must know how to swim and in good physical condition and must not have had any alcoholic beverages to drink prior to entering the water. Guests must be 21 years of age or older to be served alcoholic beverages.

BAS-G / Golf at Royal St. Kitts

The Royal St. Kitts Golf Club is a spectacular Caribbean golf course. Originally opened in 1976, Royal St. Kitts is one of the best conditioned and most scenic golf courses in the Caribbean.

After closing for renovations in the spring of 2002, the first nine holes and the beautiful new clubhouse opened for play in November 2003. The full 18-hole championship course then reopened on November 8th, 2004. The magnificent layout has 125 irrigated acres of lush grass and allows golfers to play two full holes on the Caribbean Sea and three complete holes on the Atlantic Ocean. The redesign was done by famed architect Thomas McBroom of Toronto, Canada.

Royal St. Kitts plays as an 18-hole, Par 71 course at 6,900 yards / 6309 metres from the championship gold tees. But with three other sets of tees it is fun for every level of player. This extraordinary layout boasts water hazards on 10 holes, 80 bunkers and a multitude of coconut palm trees along the Atlantic Ocean.

Please note: This programme includes roundtrip transportation, green fees and shared cart. Golfers must adhere to the course's dress code and policies. Please advise Shore Concierge Staff upon embarkation of your rental needs. Rental Clubs: Taylor Made Burner - \$65 per set. All rentals and purchases are to be paid directly to Pro Shop. A minimum of 4 golfers is required to operate this programme at the price noted.

BAS-H / Best of St. Kitts

Difficulty



Price: \$79 - Duration: 4.50 hr(s)

Experience the picturesque beauty and historic landmarks of St. Kitts during this half-day sightseeing excursion of Basseterre and its environs.

Your tour guide will take you through Basseterre, the oldest town in the Eastern Caribbean where elements of French and British colonization have been carefully preserved - Berkeley Memorial, Independence Square (a former slave market) and the impressive architecture of the buildings surrounding them both.

Brimstone Hill Fortress and National Park

This most impressive and imposing fortress has a correspondingly significant history. Known as the Gibraltar of the West Indies, it protected British interests in this part of the Caribbean during the 18th and 19th centuries. This architectural marvel is a tribute to the skills of British military engineering and African slave labour and is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Stunning views of the national park and the neighbouring islands can be had from atop the Citadel or anywhere on the parade ground.

Caribelle Batik

Watch as local artists transform Sea Island Cotton into stunning Batik fabrics. As you watch the secrets of this ancient art form unfold, you will be treated to a full explanation. Caribelle Batik's sought after products are all available in a lovely West Indian Great House setting.

Romney Manor

Set in extensive and meticulously maintained grounds, this 12-acre botanical paradise is a wonder to behold. Tropical blooms, exotic palms, flowering shrubs and delicate orchids offer a riot of colour, while humming birds, egrets and wandering green vervet monkeys go their merry way. Samuel Jefferson, the great grandfather of Thomas Jefferson, 3rd President of the USA, was the original owner of this splendid estate.

Fairview Great House

Step back in time as Fairview Great House provides a true representation of a colonial St. Kitts Great House with the Great House rooms furnished in authentic colonial style. The Great House as displays a historical information room where you can learn more about previous owners of the property, life on the island in colonial times and the process undertaken to fully restore this historic gem. From the cobble stone courtyard view the original kitchen with its volcanic stone and brick oven; the original bathing room with its large sun warmed volcanic stone bath; and stone bridge leading from the rear veranda of the Great House to the rear area of the tropical botanical garden. While in the courtyard don't forget to wander into the old stone cellar where you will find a gift shop offering unique Fairview gifts and souvenirs for your shopping delight. The meticulously landscaped tropical botanical garden feature settings and plants of the 1700s - 1920s with a wide variety of fruit trees, palms, shrubs and flowering plants.

Timothy Hill

Your final stop will be for photos at the top of Timothy Hill. Prepare to feast your eyes on absolutely breathtaking scenes. Romney Manor, Caribelle Batik

Start your day by meeting your guide and accessible van at the St. Kitts cruise dock. From here, you will head out on a short drive through the capital city Basseterre. Here you will admire colorful island homes, beautiful old architecture and a few city highlights, before heading out on a drive through the rainforest to the first stop of your tour, Romney Manor and Caribelle Batik. Romney Manor is an old sugar plantation dating back to the 1626, with beautiful old ruins, vibrant lush grounds and a centuries old saman tree. On the property, you will find the Caribelle Batik store and exhibition. See how batik is made and browse the shop for gifts. While parts of the venue are inaccessible due to grass and steps, your guide will lead you using the accessible routes to show you as much of the venue as possible. The Batik store and demonstration is accessible via a ramp.

Brimstone Fortress

Next, your tour continues to Brimstone Fortress and National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This well-preserved fortress is located on a hill and offers spectacular views of the ocean and old ruins. The lower level of the fort is accessible with mostly flat grounds. There is some grass if you wish to get close to the old ruins or the cannons. The movie room and gift shop are fully accessible with ramps. Please note that the upper part of the Fort is not accessible.

Timothy Hill

While you will stop and experience many beautiful viewpoints along your drive, Timothy Hill Scenic Outlook may turn out to be your very favorite. You will have a unique opportunity to capture beautiful photos with the Atlantic Ocean on one side and the Caribbean Ocean on the other. The viewpoint is mostly flat and has gravel. There are small vendor stands with souvenirs and snacks located by the viewpoint as well.

Paddle your way through mangroves, glide over tranquil lagoons and enjoy the crystal clear waters of the Caribbean Sea. Discover one of Antigua's secret beauty spots where you will see local sea life and birds in their natural, unspoiled environment, during this half-day eco-tour.

Board the mini-van at the pier and depart for a 35-minute scenic drive along the north coast towards the North Sound National Park, where your adventure begins.

Mangrove Kayaking

Head out by motorboat and reach the kayaks moored in a quiet lagoon. After a short safety briefing and demonstration on technique, board your two-seater 'sit-on-top' ocean kayak, take off to tiny uninhabited islands and inlets and learn about the delicate mangrove Eco system. Discover Antigua's coastline whilst sailing on the state-of-the art sleek sailing catamaran.

You will be met at the ship by your tour guide and escorted a few yards to your awaiting modern sailing catamaran and expert, courteous and knowledgeable crew. From here you will embark on an exhilarating enjoyable boat ride around the north coast to Great Bird Island, one of Antigua's best locations for snorkeling.

Sailing to Great bird Island

Great Bird Island is a 20 acre islet lying almost three kilometres north-east of Antigua. Visitors to Great Bird Island regard it as a 'desert island' dream.

Named by sailors who were amazed at the number of birds that they found living and nesting there, Great Bird Island is a miniature paradise. White sand beaches at either end of the sandbar are the main attraction for visitors.

Whilst it is better known for its superb beaches and closely surrounding coral reefs than any wildlife, it is also the only place you may be able to see an *Antiguan Racer* snake in the wild. (They are only 20 cms long at best and harmless). The entire world population of this snake lives on the island. As well as being the last refuge of the *Antiguan Racer* snake, it's the home for a variety of endangered creatures including exotic red-billed tropic birds (*Phaeton astherus*), brown pelican (*Pelecanus occidentalis*), rare lizard, West Indian whistling ducks and the magnificent frigate bird or man o' war bird (*Fregata magnificens*).

Snorkeling or swimming

You will be given a tuition in snorkelling before you are invited to put on your mask, fins and buoyancy belt and go snorkelling accompanied with expert guides in the crystal clear waters! Or you can simply take a swim or relax and soak up the sun in the idyllic location on board the boat.

When you return there will be sandwiches and an open bar where you can enjoy rum punch, beers, water and soft drinks.

Lunch and beach stop

The sail continues in the Caribbean waters to another deserted beach where we will drop anchor and serve a delicious Caribbean lunch of baked chicken or fish, green salad, rice and peas, macaroni cheese pie, vegetables and garlic bread with an open bar.

En route back to St John's there will be a beach stop to another of Antigua's famous white sands beaches.

You can then sit back and relax as you are taken on a wonderful fun filled boating experience along the south west coast en route to St John's, taking in the colourful villages, white sand beaches and rural sights.

This is an opportunity to enjoy the Caribbean as it used to be; peaceful and tranquil yet available for as much fun as you want to make. Take a boat ride, snorkel in crystal clear waters whilst you see a wonder of brightly coloured Caribbean fish right in front of you; swim, enjoy drinks from the open bar and visit a deserted island and Antigua's famed 365 beaches; enjoy the tour prepared by people who know Antigua and Caribbean the best and simply relax

Valley Church Beach offers over a half-mile (about 0.8 kilometres) of soft, white sand bordered by coconut palms and sea grape trees. Valley Church Beach also features restrooms, freshwater showers, and a beach bar and restaurant.

Complimentary Drink, Sunbathing, Beachcombing, Swimming, Caribbean Sea

Upon arrival at Valley Church Beach, you are greeted with a complimentary Caribbean cocktail (fruit or rum punch) and given a brief tour of the beach facilities. During your beach escape, enjoy approximately three hours of relaxation whilst you soak up the warm, tropical sun in a complimentary sun chair and shared umbrella. First, you'll set out on a beautiful scenic island drive through banana plantations and beautiful mountain views, before making a stop in Anse La Ray, a small charming fishing village to the far western side of the island right next to Castries. In Anse La Ray, you will exit the van by the small center square to get out and explore firsthand. Take a stroll down the small pier, meet local fishermen and see what they caught for the day, make your way around the charming little city streets with traditional small cottages, and visit the beautiful old cathedral from the early 16th century. Piton views As your tour continues to the city of Soufriere, you will make several photo stops along the way. Not only is St. Lucia lush and rich in produce, it is a volcanic island which provides some amazing views, including the Pitons. While the Pitons volcano site is not wheelchair accessible, one can still see them from afar and capture some beautiful photos. Diamond Botanical Garden In Soufriere, you will experience one of the only fully accessible waterfall views in the world! In the popular Diamond Botanical Garden, your tour guide will take you on a spectacular stroll while sharing all that he knows about the fauna and produce of the island. The path in the garden is accessible with no steps or steep inclines. At the end of the Gardens, you will see the amazing Diamond Waterfall right in front of you. A traditional St. Lucia buffet lunch will be served at an accessible restaurant close to the gardens.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking. This tour is specially designed for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair or a scooter. The driver will place non-collapsible wheelchairs into the rear of the vehicle, and bring them out at each sightseeing stop, however guides are not allowed to push wheelchairs. Lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Departing from the cruise terminal, journey through the city of Castries and the winding curves heading up the Morne, where you can marvel at the lush vegetation and homes perched along the hillside.

St. Marks

A stop is made at St. Marks, a rambling colonial house that stands on the hillside overlooking the harbour. Capture the views of Castries harbour amidst the deep blue sea with a green backdrop. At this enchanting building enjoy a brief demonstration on the art of Batik.

Fond Latisab Creole Park

Depart for a drive through the countryside to Fond Latisab - Taste St. Lucia's very own local Creole traditions as you join a cultural tour of the Fond Latisab Creole Park in the beautiful community of Babonneau. Experience cultural practices such as; the preparation of cassava bread, cooking on macambou leaves, and the very authentic display of wood-sawing, all while the Chak-Chak band plays traditional music in the background.

Discover the ancient Amerindian manner as you witness several traditional practices. See the fascinating method of log sawing to the rhythmic music of a local Chak-Chak band as you experience a glimpse into the rich folk heritage of St. Lucia. You might even be able to learn a few words of Patois, the language of Creole heavily laced with French, African and English grammar. You'll have the opportunity to taste the cassava bread and a local fruit drink before returning to your ship.

Segway Orientation

Depart the pier by coach and make the journey north to the Segway Welcome Centre. Upon arrival, you will receive a safety briefing and instruction, followed by some practice time on the Segway Practice Track before beginning your adventure.

Mount Pimard and Pebble Beach

Following your guide, glide over the scenic nature trail up beautiful Mount Pimard to enjoy breath-taking views of St. Lucia's dramatic West Coast. Along the route, your guide tells you about everything from the beautiful flowers and butterflies to the battles between the English and French for the fair 'Helen of the West', St. Lucia.

Your aircraft flies over Castries Harbour and along the western shoreline of St. Lucia. The flight continues over Marigot Bay and heads south to Soufrière, where the majestic Pitons rise directly from the sea to the sky. The return flight takes you inland for a view of St. Lucia's volcanic hot springs and tropical rain forest. At the conclusion of your flight, return to the ship with the great feeling of having experienced St. Lucia in its entire natural splendor.

Please note: This tour requires a minimum amount of walking; however guests must be able to climb in and out of a helicopter. Operation of this tour depends on weather conditions. Seating is at the discretion of the pilot and there may be a weight restriction of 220 pounds (100 kilograms). Gondolas, Rainforest trees, Lavender stars

Upon arrival you are geared up with a harness and helmet and receive a health and safety introduction. Next, after completing the training cable, you embark the aerial tram for your slow ascent through the wonders of the rainforest. Gondolas safely glide through and over the treetops, where knotted and twisting woody vines wind to the tops of old growth rainforest trees. Dense thickets of surreal vegetation merge with cascades of flowers. Lavender stars, orange bursts, yellow berries and white magnolia flowers and lace thrive on the branches of fragrant flowering trees. Once at the top station, disembark and continue on a trail descending through the thicket of the rain forest.

Hike, Sky Canopy Platform

Following a hike of approximately 20 minutes you reach the first Sky Canopy platform. The first zip cable is only the beginning of an exhilarating experience of sailing along eight zip cables. You fly among the high rain forest trees such as Gommier and Chatannier with great views of the north of the island, Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea.

After the zip-line flight, begin the return hike to the top station of the aerial tram for the descent back to terra firma via a relaxing gondola ride. From the base of the tram, re-board the coach for the return to the ship.

Please note: This is an adventurous tour, participants should be reasonably fit. It is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilise a wheelchair. Flora and Fauna, Aerial Tram

The canopy is home to an enormous amount of flora and fauna that inhabits the rainforest. In their eagerness to search for light and space, many plants have colonised the treetops turning them into small ecosystems. Fauna is very abundant throughout the tropical rainforests, however; animals are difficult to spot during the day. From the Aerial Tram you can also appreciate all the different shades of green as well as the various sizes and shapes that the leaves have created as a strategy to capture sunlight. The course is very secure and very quiet; this allows you to listen to the many different sounds of the rainforest.

Beginning from the pier on a fully air-conditioned bus, travel through the Capital city of Castries through the mountains to a village nestled over 2,000 ft. (600 metres) in the mountains. On your way, be treated to magnificent views of St. Lucia's beautiful country-side. The ride takes 30 minutes from the pier in the North of the island to the base station.

At the site, a brief orientation and safety instruction will be given, followed by your Aerial Tram journey into the rainforest. The Rainforest Sky Rides in St. Lucia provides the visitor with a bird's eye view of a truly mature Caribbean oceanic rainforest. Nurtured by warm, gentle rains and rich volcanic soils, St. Lucia's forests have achieved a state of ancient majesty.

Open-air gondolas safely glide you through and over the tree tops, where knotted and twisting woody vines wind to the tops of old growth rainforest trees. Dense thickets of surreal vegetation merge with cascades of flowers. Lavender stars, orange bursts, yellow berries and white lace thrive on the branches of fragrant flowering trees. Giant 'Chatannier', Magnolia, Gommier trees tower over the landscape and provide food and shelter for St. Lucia's endemic and endangered parrot. Here, the flowers bloom with shameless abundance. Experience St. Lucia's forest from a whole new perspective and witness this ancient celebration of colour and life with the option to walk the Fern Nature trail as well.

The *Hummingbird Café* and the Duty-free Amazonas Gift Shop are also available at the premises for your convenience.

This tour concludes at the pier.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking. All Rain Forest Sky Rides properties are non-smoking. For the optional walk, closed shoes or sandals are mandatory (no flip flops or high heels). It is also recommended to bring an umbrella or rain poncho in case of unexpected, island rain showers. Pigeon Island is composed of two peaks and is an historic site. Fort Rodney was used by the British to spy on French Ships from neighbouring Martinique, during the battle for St. Lucia. Cruise into the Rodney Bay Marina with the view of some of the most beautiful water front homes and yachts from all over the world.

As you depart Rodney Bay, your sunset cruise continues along the West coast, bypassing the Castries Harbour to the famous Marigot Bay. Known as one of the most beautiful bays in the Caribbean, Marigot Bay was featured in the Movies Dr. Doolittles starring Rex Harrison and Fire Power starring Sophia Loren and James Coburn. Cruise into this peaceful bay also a hurricane shelter for yachts on Island and from all over the world. As you cruise into the bay take in the view of Resorts, Café, Restaurants, Shopping plaza etc. before cruising back to the Castries Harbour and enjoying a Caribbean Sunset from the water.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of activity and approximately 160 yards (about 146 metres) of walking, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach and embark/disembark the catamaran, and 6-10 steps to enter the water via the water ladder. This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition, and is not suitable for guests with heart and respiratory problems, guests with neck, back, leg and/or hip conditions, guests prone to seasickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. En route, pass by the bustling, colourful Castries Market, historic Roman Catholic Church and City Square named in honour of the island's second Nobel Laureate, Sir Derek Walcott. From here, take a short drive up Morne Fortune to the Morne Viewpoint for a spectacular panoramic view of the Castries Harbour.

Chassin, La Sourcier Mountain, Castries Waterworks Reserve and Rainforest Walk

Throughout the class, learn about the many fascinating health benefits of trinitario dark chocolate. A 20-minute cooling-down period allows the liquefied chocolate to solidify after it has been put into its mould. During the break, you can take in spectacular panoramic views of the city, enjoy a beverage from the Cellar Bar or browse the duty-free gift shop. Following the break, class resumes and the end result is a beautiful, approximately 1.75-ounce (about 50-gram) dark chocolate bar that is foil-wrapped and presented to you to take home as perhaps your most distinctive souvenir of Saint Lucia. 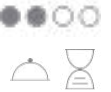

ROE-001 / River tubing, Rainforest Drive & Waterfalls

Roseau, JacoFalls, Waterfall, Waterfall Pool

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 40-minute drive to Jaco Falls. Take in splendid vistas of this lovely little waterfall and its waterfall pool from the scenic viewpoint; you may also opt to descend the 57 steps leading down to the waterfall pool for a closer look.

Rainforest Drive, Hibiscus Eco-Village, Refreshment, Carib Indians, Traditional Dance

Next, re-board your coach and take a drive through the central rainforest reserve en route to the Hibiscus Eco-Village, the starting point for your tubing adventure. This eco-village is renowned for its beautiful surroundings and natural river pools. With changing rooms, washrooms and easy river access, this site is the ideal starting point for your river tubing adventure.

River-Tubing, Rainforest, Birdlife, Vegetation, Rapids, Pools, Carib Indian Territory, Concord Valley

After receiving your tubing and safety instructions, embark your river-tube for a picturesque and peaceful, approximately 1.5-hour voyage in the heart of the pristine rainforest. The river takes you on a good combination of fast rapids and lazy, slow-flowing pools, making your journey both fun-filled and relaxing. Your route takes you downriver to the last, and only, Carib Indian territory in the world. Along the way, marvel at the diverse birdlife, vegetation and spectacular natural scenery staged by the beautiful Concord Valley. At the conclusion of your tour, re-board your coach and commence the approximately one-hour drive back to the pier.

Roseau, Morne Trois Pitons National Park, Freshwater Lake

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 30-minute drive to Morne Trois Pitons National Park, located approximately 2.5 miles (about four kilometres) from the village of Laudat. Upon arrival at the park, drive to a freshwater lake, the largest in Dominica. The freshwater lake, located at an elevation of approximately 2,500 feet (about 762 metres), is nestled inside an old volcanic crater at the foot of Morne Macaque.

Morne Micotrin, Breathtaking Vistas, Guided Hike

The route to the freshwater lake runs along the southern edge of Morne Micotrin, the fourth-tallest mountain in Dominica, and takes you to the highest point on the island. Here, breath-taking panoramic vistas can be enjoyed from the bus. The road is lined with beautiful trees, flowers, and houses, and the valley views are stunning. The hiking trail is a nature preserve-approved trail. Upon arrival at the small Visitor's Centre, a comfort stop is made before starting your guided, approximately 45-minute hike. Whilst the trail is rather strenuous, both up-and-down, with bridges and steps to negotiate, walking it is visually-stunning nonetheless. Following your hike and a comfort stop, enjoy fresh tropical fruit and refreshments.

Roseau Valley, Trafalgar Falls, Nature Trail, Ginger Plants, Orchids, Free Time

Next, re-board your coach and drive through the Roseau Valley, then proceed to Trafalgar for a visit to Trafalgar Falls. Upon arrival at the Hibiscus Eco-Village, enjoy a traditional welcome dance by the Carib Indians; Dominica is the only place in the world that has a Carib Indian community.

Marigot Fishing Harbour, Boat-Ride, and Bay Beach, Swimming, Dominican Lunch

Leaving the Hibiscus Eco-Village, re-board your coach and head to the Marigot Fishing Harbour. Upon arrival, embark a local boat for the short ride across to Sand Bay Beach. Nestled between two cliffs, the beach gives the perfect feeling of a 'hideaway' beach. The beach is a mixture between white sand and black, volcanic sand from when the island originated. Upon arrival at the beach, proceed for swimming and a traditional Dominican 'cook up on the beach' lunch prepared over an open fire; an integral part of Dominican culture.

Boat-Ride, Marigot Fishing Harbour, Twin Falls, Short Hike, Twin Cascading Waterfalls, Swimming

Next, embark the boat for the short ride back to the Marigot Fishing Harbour, then re-board your coach for the picturesque drive to the spectacular Twin Falls. Leaving the parking area, a short, guided hike brings you to Twin Falls. Situated in the middle of the rainforest, idyllic Twin Falls features stunning waterfalls cascading side-by-side out of the deep gorges they have carved out. More adventurous guests can clamber over the rocks and a steep hill for a dip in the small pool at the base of the white sulphur waterfalls. The sensation of bathing in these beautiful waterfalls, and feeling the mystique of the surrounding rainforest, is not to be missed. At the conclusion of your visit, walk back to your coach and commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the pier.

Jaco Falls

Upon arrival at Jaco Falls, take an easy, 30-yard (27-metre) stroll to the scenic viewpoint at this waterfall. Here, you can photograph your beautiful surroundings while snacking on local seasonal fruits served with complimentary rum punch or fruit juice. You may also opt to take a short walk down some steps to the pool for a quick dip in the refreshing waterfall. Afterward, drive through the beautiful green valleys en route to the pier.

Depart the pier for the brief stroll to your awaiting vessel. Upon arrival, receive your safety and tour instructions before setting out for the open waters. Of the 30 or more species of whales and dolphins found in the Caribbean, more than half can be found in the waters surrounding Dominica. Your captain pauses every three miles (about 4.8 kilometres) or 15 minutes so a hydrophone may be submersed to listen for the 'clicking' of sperm whales and the 'whistling' of dolphins.

During these stops, take in distant island views while your on-board guide offers information about the whales, dolphins, and wildlife. If a spout or a pod is sighted or detected, the captain manoeuvres the vessel so you can see the animals. Since their welfare is of paramount importance, guidelines set up by the International Fund for Animal Welfare are strictly followed. Fruit juice is served during the return ride to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a minimal amount of walking. Guests must be able to walk and manoeuvre in and out of the boat, and participants with limited mobility may be accommodated. Although marine life can be observed on most outings, sightings cannot be guaranteed.

Whether hiking through lush jungle or rappelling halfway down a rock to drop in the water below, your day is sure to be filled with the sound of cheers for every natural obstacle tackled. A breathtaking view unveiled with every step taken, you will discover new treasures to admire as the surrounding scenery changes throughout your adventure and offers an array of native plants and wildlife to learn about.

Magical Canyon

This epic excursion will call for swimwear, a towel and closed footwear of your own, and your guides will take care of the rest. After getting geared up at Extreme Dominica's headquarters you will learn how to rappel on a 8-foot training wall and receive a briefing before you go on a 15 minute drive to the canyon where the real adventure begins. After traversing the magical

canyon the tour concludes with a 15 minute hike back to the vehicle. The tour ends at the canyoning school with hot cocoa tea and fresh local fruit.

Upon arrival, some free time is made available to relax and unwind amidst your idyllic surrounds, take a leisurely stroll on the beach, and/or swim in the warm, inviting, crystal-clear waters of the Caribbean Sea. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Experience the spectacular beauty and snorkelling of southern Dominica during this scenic, half-day snorkelling safari.

Roseau, Caribbean Coastline, Soufrière Bay, Scotts Head Isthmus, Atlantic Ocean

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 30-minute drive south to the very tip of Dominica, and a visit to the quaint fishing village of Scotts Head. En route, proceed along the Caribbean coastline and through the charming fishing village of Soufrière, named after the French word 'sulfur' because of the sulphur springs that exist in the valleys of the nearby Morne Patate volcanic crater. Upon arrival at Scotts Head, traverse the Scotts Head Isthmus separating the powerful Atlantic Ocean from the calm of Soufrière Bay.

Soufrière Catholic Church, Soufriere/Scotts Head Marine Reserve, Champagne Reef

From here, return to see the Soufrière Catholic Church, which is over 200 years old, then proceed to Champagne Reef. Located in the Soufriere/Scotts Head Marine Reserve, the spectacular Champagne Reef is Dominica's premier diving and snorkeling site, and ranks among the top five snorkeling sites in the Caribbean. Underwater geothermal springs vent gasses in the form of thousands of warm bubbles, giving you a feeling of swimming through a giant glass of champagne.

Guided Snorkelling, Marine Life, Sponges, Lobsters, Parrot Fish, Turtles, 17th-Century Shipwreck

Upon arrival, receive your safety and tour instructions, and be outfitted with snorkelling gear. Your reef tour is led by professional PADI-certified dive masters who brief you on the correct use of your gear, and what you are likely to see and experience once in the water. Expect to see a myriad of marine life, including sponges, lobster, parrot fish, and a resident population of Hawksbill and green turtles. You may also see sea horses and the remains of a 17th-century Spanish shipwreck, including the cannons and chain links. After your snorkelling session, return your gear, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Morne Bruce Gardens

Depart the pier for the brief drive to the historic Morne Bruce Gardens. Upon arrival, take in splendid views and photo opportunities of the town of Roseau, and Dominica's towering cliffs and lush rainforest. Leaving the gardens, re-board your coach and drive through the Roseau Valley, then continue on to Trafalgar for a visit to Trafalgar Falls.

Trafalgar Falls and Wotten Waven

Experience the beauty of Trafalgar Falls, which feature a sulphur spa and waterfalls cascading side-by-side out of the deep gorges they have carved out. During your visit, take a 20-minute walk up the nature trail. Pass by ginger plants and vanilla orchids before arriving at a panoramic viewpoint above the river. Leaving the falls, drive east to the village of Wotten Waven, among the most active volcanic regions on the island, then continue on to the sulphur springs.

Bongo Baths & Spa and Refreshments

A few minutes later you will arrive at a haven in the hills. You then take a short walk along natural steps to the open air natural pools for a 45-minute hot mineral bath coming direct from an underground source. Enjoy the beauty of the natural surroundings while you soak in warm therapeutic sulphur water to relax your muscles and joints whilst detoxifying and cleansing the body. You can lounge in the shade for a few minutes on the handmade bamboo benches, inhaling the fresh cool mountain breeze then cap off your experience with some healthy local refreshment or water. A new re-energized you will return to your ship.

Gustavia, Lighthouse, Airport

Depart the pier for a scenic sightseeing drive through Gustavia en route to an exterior photo stop at the Lighthouse. Upon arrival, receive a brief introduction about the history of the island and construction of Gustavia. Re-board your coach and head to a vantage point near the airport; if possible, see a plane landing.

Saline, Grand Fond, Grand Cul de Sac, Point Milou, Colombier Viewpoint and Bay, Flamands Beach

Your tour continues with a drive to Saline. Upon arrival, see the salt ponds and learn about their importance in the evolution of the island's economy. Leaving Saline, re-board your van and drive to Grand Fond, where the vantage-point offers views of the Atlantic Ocean. Next, depart the port area, under sails. Enjoy peaceful and quiet sailing time in the vicinity of the harbour area, pass by mega yachts at anchor, and take in spectacular panoramic views of the sunset and your surroundings.

Complimentary Refreshments and Snacks

Complimentary champagne, beer, soft drinks, mineral water, and assorted snacks are served during the cruise. At the conclusion of your scenic and relaxing sail, return to the pier, disembark the catamaran and commence the short walk back to the ship.

SBH-E / Panoramic St. Barts

Enjoy a panoramic ride around this tiny island and discover the many hidden beauties for which St. Barts has become famous.

Gustavia, Le Col de la Tourmente, St. Jean Beach, Salines

Minibus 'taxis' with drivers who speak varying degrees of English with a heavy French-West-Indian accent, take you on a drive through St. Barts. The first stop, at Le Col de la Tourmente, overlooks the most popular beach, St. Jean Beach and the island's airport. The taxis then follow take the road to Salines (salt ponds), an industrial area of the island. At one time St. Barts exported salt all over the Caribbean.

Grand Pond, Petit and Grand Cul de Sacs, Marigot, La Cave

After your visit to Salines, your driver will go through Petite Salines, the only place on the island where you cannot see the ocean, and continue to Grand Fond. The view is breathtaking, with the road overlooking the green valley and the raging ocean breaking on the shoreline. It can be very windy, and the landscape varies from the rest of the island. Only a few years ago, Grand Fond was the cattle center for St. Barts, home not only to many cows, but also goats and sheep.

L'Orient, La Vigie, Coupe

Continue on the road along the coast to view the house that belonged to the famous Russian dancer, Rudolf Nureyev. It is located right on the rocks facing the ocean. Pass Petit-Cul de Sac (small salt pond) and Grand Cul de Sac with its large lagoon and many hotels and resorts. It is here that the 24-hour windsurf regatta is held in August each year. Continue to Marigot,

famous for its wine shop, La Cave, that has in stock over 300,000 bottles of wine, ranging from the cheapest to the most rare and expensive. Then continue to L'Orient and its two flower-filled cemeteries.

Passing La Vigie and Coupe Gorge, your vehicles return to the St. Jean area before taking the road to Corossol, once famous for its women who wore traditional white bonnets and were known for weaving straw hats and baskets. Please note that this does not exist anymore, despite what is written in the guidebooks. After climbing the last hill, your taxi returns to Gustavia. Depending on traffic conditions, the taxis will either stop in the parking lot next to the pier or in town at the main taxi station.

Please note: This tour involves a minimum amount of walking; however, guests must be able to climb in and out of a minibus taxi. This is not a guided tour; it is an orientation drive of the island. Your driver may speak only rudimentary English.

SBH-G / ATV Adventure

After tendering ashore, a short taxi ride will take you to meet your instructor. Guests will be given safety instructions and itinerary briefing. St. Jean, Col de la Tourente, Morne Tourterelle, Salines and Petit Cul de Sac Beaches

Continue to St. Jean via the famous Col de la Tourente and head up Morne Tourterelle, overlooking the Salines beach area. En route, your guide explains about the areas salt ponds and the island's salt industry, which served as St. Barts primary industry until the mid-1950's. Proceed along the windward side of the island, savouring the dramatic views of Grand Fond, dominated by the Atlantic Ocean and 938-foot (280-metre)-high Morne Vitet. In Toiny, leave the main road and take the narrow path to Petit Cul de Sac Beach.

Morne Vitet, Villages of Mariot and Lorient

A steep climb brings you to the villages of Mariot and Lorient with magnificent panoramas of the countryside. The ATV tour will end in town, from here take a leisurely stroll around the the harbour to return to the ship, alternatively continue your exploration with a walk to Shell Beach, or explore the local shops.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of activity and is suitable for guests in good physical condition only. There are inherent risks associated with participating in this tour. Guests will be evaluated prior to participation, by the tour leader; if determined not to be in acceptable physical condition to safely operate and maintain control of the ATV on the surfaces you will be encountering, participation will be denied and a 50% fee will be charged. This tour requires the completion of an acknowledgement that a safety briefing has been provided prior to departing on the ATV. Participation will be denied to anyone who does not sign the acknowledgement. This tour is priced per ATV, two guests per vehicle. When requesting this tour online, please indicate the number of vehicles desired and not the number of guests participating. Maximum weight per ATV is 330 pounds (150 kilograms or 23.5 stone). ATV drivers must bring a valid driver's license and a credit card with their name on for the 2000 Euro deductible in the event of damages to the ATV or property. Gustavia's harbour, St Barts Marine Park

Walk from the pier to the awaiting semi-submersible submarine and gather on the main deck for a safety briefing. Cruising out of the main harbour, remain top-side or descend into the hull of the sub. As you reach the entrance of Gustavia's harbour, you may see some of the many green turtles known to reside in the area. Pass over the wreck of the 50-foot (15-metre) island freighter *Marignan*, sunk during the famous hurricane 'Luis' in 1995. On the way to your next stop, the vessel crosses the south-east edge of the St. Barts Marine Park, where the sea is full of colourful coral reefs, gently 'invaded' by troops of striped 'sergeant major' fish.

Returning to the pier along the same route, you can remain below or if you prefer, cruise on the upper deck and watch the beautiful anchored yachts and shores of St. Barts.

Please note: This tour requires a minimal amount of walking; however, guests must be able to walk a short distance to the sub and negotiate steep stairs to enter and exit the sub's hull. A scenic safari bus ride along the south side of St. Thomas brings you to the Mangrove Lagoon Wildlife Refuge & Marie Sanctuary where a truly unique experience awaits you and your family. Kayak past many small islands of the mangrove lagoon.

Hike through a mangrove forest; along a scenic beach of coral & shell rubble with views overlooking the Caribbean Sea, Buck Island & French Cap in the distance. There are tidal pools, breathtaking volcanic cliffs and the impressive Red Point geologic Blow Hole. Enjoy the excitement of a hermit crab race.

Snorkel in the clear protected waters of the coral-fringed mangrove lagoon and view a remnant of a shipwreck teeming with colorful marine life. Try and spot shy turtles, stingrays, starfish, conch, puffer fish, tropical birds and lizards in their natural habitat. Watch for rays & barracudas on your return paddle. This is a beginner snorkel and no experience is necessary.

Please note: This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition, and is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. The *Castaway Girl* is fast and very stable, having spacious sunbathing decks and a large comfortable cockpit for those of you preferring the shade, as you sail in the warm breezes and crystal clear waters of the Caribbean Sea.

Spend time snorkelling and exploring beautiful coral reefs filled with tropical fish, sea animals and turtles. The wartime shipwreck of the *Catanza C* lies 25' below the surface and is home to a wide variety of sea life. The friendly, experienced crew and instructors will provide all of the assistance that you need, as they snorkel with you, pointing out the wonderous sights to be seen below. Enjoy complimentary tropical fruit punch drinks, our famous *Castaway Girl Painkiller Punch*, along with other refreshments and snacks as you listen to some great music on your relaxing homeward sail back to your ship.

SJU-F / Discovering San Juan (Tour & Airport Transfer)

Enjoy the scenery as you drive through one of the most beautiful old cities in the New World with a short visit to Fort San Cristobal and additional time to explore the city on own before you return home.

Fort San Cristobal

Your first stop is for a short visit to Fort San Cristobal, a mainstay of the San Juan fortification system, from which the Spanish successfully defended their city from British and Dutch attacks as well as frequent assaults from various and sundry pirates. Be sure to watch their historical video on the area. In addition, search out the dungeon where there are centuries old graffiti representing images of Spanish galleons drawn on the walls.

Old San Juan

As you continue your drive through the old city, you'll see the beautiful 17th-century Spanish ironwork on the restored homes and note the blue-black glazed cobblestones that were brought to San Juan as ballast for the Spanish galleons, and were used to surface the narrow streets of the Old City.

In addition, armed with our map of Old San Juan, you have time to explore some of the many interesting shops, boutiques and art galleries that have made this historic area their home. Following your free time, re-join your coach for the drive to the airport, during which time you will drive through the newer parts of San Juan.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking over cobblestone and uneven surfaces. We suggest guests wear lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, walking shoes and sun protection, as well as a poncho or umbrella in case of rain. This tour is suitable for guests with flights departing San Juan after 2:00 p.m.

SJU-E / Walking Tour through Old San Juan

Explore the highlights along cobblestone streets and gain a fascinating guided look at the history of Old San Juan during this walking tour of the old city.

Fort San Cristobal

Upon disembarkation, meet your experienced guide who will lead you through the historical Old City including a visit to Fort San Cristobal, a fortification that successfully defended the old city from attack by the British and Dutch in centuries gone by.

Next, walk into the City through one of the side streets and commence on a stroll through history. Getting just off the beaten track offers some fascinating finds that eludes most visitors that never leave the main streets.

La Plazoleta de la Rogativa

Exit the gardens of Casa Blanca through a partially hidden access to Calle Sol, or the Street of the Sun. After making the tight descending turn downwards, you suddenly find yourself in the most beautiful section of the entire old city - the Plaza of the Procession. Dominating this little park area is a statue commemorating the miraculous saving of the old city from sacking by the British in the 16th century.

This vantage point offers views of the Governor's Mansion, the El Cañuelo fortress across the port entrance and the Bacardi distillery. A short walk down hill through San Juan Gate takes you to the water's edge. As you return through the San Juan gate continue to San Juan Cathedral, retracing the steps of the original conquistadores. Your guide will walk you to the corner of Cristo & Fortaleza Streets; at this point you decide if you wish to have the guide escort you back to the ship or if you wish to stay to explore the many boutiques and shops that line the cobblestone streets of the old city and return to the ship at your leisure.
